

We are also on the look out for people who are keen to lend a bit of a helping hand, nothing hard, but all necessary to make the day a success, especially since it has been a while since our last day. Start saving for Super Saver rewards.


The First Credit Union School Banking Programme is a great way to learn about saving money! While you are saving, you can also earn Super Saver rewards along the way.


