PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Kia ora koutou

The coronavirus has made its way onto New Zealand shores so you may be wondering what Manawaru School is doing to plan and prepare for an event like this.

The Ministries of Education and Health have been providing excellent communication to schools on this issue for the last few weeks and we have been following the daily updates from them. Their current advice is that everybody should follow basic hygiene principles to reduce the risk of getting sick or passing it on to others:

- Regularly washing hands (for at least 20 seconds with soap and water and dry thoroughly).
- Covering coughs and sneezes with clean tissues or with an elbow
- Staying home if you are sick.

Parents around NZ are getting worried about coronavirus, but what about children? Are your kids worried? What do you tell them that's true, and not alarming? Seven Sharp covered this brilliantly this week with Dr Michelle Dickinson, who suggested the easiest way to discuss coronavirus with children is to talk about what viruses actually are.
