PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

This term has certainly been action packed-again! We have a busy last week coming up, as long as the weather cooperates. We are looking forward to 'Jumping June skipping', a chance for everyone to see the amazing progress their children have made, developing their skipping skills. We are hoping that we are going see a lot of parents earlier that day to help with a bit of a clean up around the school. The inclement weather has meant the school is looking a bit tatty, and we could do with help to clean it up. It can be tricky in a school our size to keep up with maintenance, as we don't have a caretaker.

At the end of the week, the half yearly reporting comes out in Hero. We will be following these up with child led conferences in the second week of next term. This will give you all time to celebrate the learning so far, and be ready to focus on the learning ahead.

Te Aroha Kaahui Ako has received some additional funding to support school attendance. Currently we are gathering attendance information from schools to ensure we spend this money well. The focus will be on trying to ensure good habits around school attendance. We know that children who have poor attendance in primary schools are likely to have worse attendance when they reach secondary schools. We also understand sometimes families need support to get their children to school. We also know that if children are at school when they are well they are more likely to be successful. I look forward to sharing more details as they evolve.

Remember our focus on attendance is for when children are well. It is good to see so many parents reporting absences through Hero. We are required to code our absences for the Ministry of Education, so knowing why a child is away is important. We are definitely seeing bugs in the school population at the moment, and it is important to keep those bugs at home. So please don't feel you need to send a sick child to school because you are worried about their attendance. Sick children can't learn, and of course, may be contagious.

There is a lot of lost property doomed for dumping unless it is claimed in the next week. It would be ideal if it was claimed. Actually if it was named so it could be claimed that would stop this wastage. Hopefully we will see it disappear next week, maybe as we see families in for the Jumping June Day!




