PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Kia ora tātou

Welcome to the end of week 7 of term 2!

What an interesting term this has been so far! It has been delightful hearing the school humming with the sound of happy people. Who would have thought 6 months ago that we would all be so pleased to come back together again.

Work continues behind the scenes, to ensure that the Covid levels are carefully managed, and schools continue to be safe places. Meetings with the Ministry of Education have continued, as we continue to develop our new normal. The Ministry has developed a national plan to support attendance and engagement. This week they have begun collecting attendance data from all schools as part of their information gathering. The Ministry of Education is confident that schools are safe from Covid-19, and are preparing to further support remaining families back to school.

As a team we continue to be impressed with the positive manner of the returning students. They are listening and being mindful of our new normal and at the same time they are getting stuck into school life. The families of these children have done a great job of preparing their children for school. It is a challenge for us all to prepare for our next, as yet unknown steps, but we are committed to ensuring student wellbeing in order to maximise progress and achievement.

A survey has gone out to our families, asking them about their experiences while their children were learning from home. As a school we will use this information to help us to develop how we work to maximise student learning. It will be great to hear from everyone, especially those who found a number of challenges along the way.

Thank you to our families who have navigated their way through Hero, the new school management system. It was really unfortunate this migration happened during the lock down. The company did rush a few bits out, thinking they were being helpful. This has proved not to be the case in many homes. But they have been in touch with us, and assured us that the kinks will be ironed out. We are all looking forward to that. This move to Hero will be worthwhile eventually I am sure. It would be helpful if you all downloaded the app. If you are uncertain of how to do this please ring school and a staff member will talk you through the process.

Moving forward we will be maintaining our Level 2 conditions at school. This will mean parents will continue to get to 'kiss and drop' at the gate. Students will be coming in and sanitising, and continuing to sanitise throughout the day. Students will be involved in cleaning surfaces, as part of their team responsibility. This is supported by adult sanitation as well. All of the details are contained in our Safety Plan in the Manawaru Governance folder in Google Drive. We are maintaining these conditions while students are transitioning to school, so everyone becomes part of the new normal. An increased awareness of virus transfer should help us avoid many winter bugs, maximising school time, long after Covid-19 is gone!

On behalf of the school team I wish every happiness to those families moving on. Thank you for sharing your children with us. We are in a privileged position, which we take very seriously. Every child and their family has added value to Manawaru School over their time here, thank you.

Eeling in the creek. Bring headlights or a torch if you have them. Wear gumboots or old shoes and warm clothes.



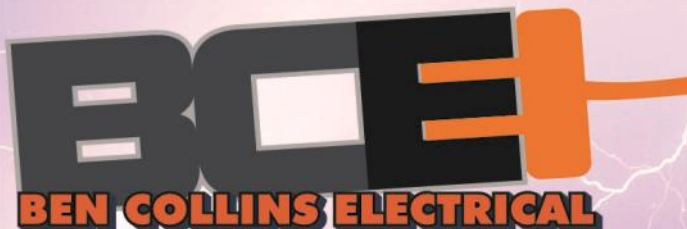
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
