PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Mihi atu ki ā tātou kātoa

I hope you all enjoyed the two week break from the school routine and had the opportunity to grab some special family time – especially those of you who have started calving. So I hope as this newsletter reaches you, the farmers amongst you, are hanging in there!

It has been a positive start to the new term. It is great to be back at school for the beginning of what we hope will be a 'normal' term in this unusual year of 2020. Term three will be a busy and active term with a number of events planned, so make sure you check out our calendar of events within this newsletter to see what is on and when.

Cross country training is now in full swing. Each day we have a training run, weather permitting. Next week we plan on running the course through the farm. Shoes are the best option. They are strongly advised as the children run on a variety of surfaces. We also suggest having a pair of shorts to pop on too as in some paddocks the grass is long and not always dry. A big thank you to Stephen Weir who has generously opened up his farm so we can run through it. The school Cross Country is in Week three (Wednesday 5 August) and District Cross Country is the following week on the 12 August.

Manawaru School is a Restorative Practice school so we focus on building and maintaining positive, respectful relationships across the school community. The 'Five Fs' (Foul up, Face up, Fess up, Fix up and Follow up) are our way of supporting learning the trickier social skills within this model. We are really focussing on this learning again as it encourages us to think about what has happened, and creates a culture of learning from our actions, rather than being punitive. Empowering learners by building on their people skills will definitely aid them in later life.

Thank you to those who responded to the Ag Day Survey. In order for this to go ahead this year we need someone to lead the team. There are a team of five who have indicated that they would be part of your team of helpers.
